

Abolition of the Death Penalty Sundays

How to host a letter writing table at your church



Faith and civic groups throughout the state are partnering with the Connecticut Network to Abolish the Death Penalty (CNADP). Abolition Sundays are a great way to ensure that your congregation's voice is heard!

What is an Abolition Sunday?

This is one or more weekends that your church encourages individuals to write letters to their legislators, and provides the space and materials to do so. Since the death penalty must be abolished through the legislative process, it is important that our Senators and Representatives know that we want them to repeal the death penalty.

Steps to a Successful Abolition Sunday

- 1) Pick one or more weekends to devote to abolition of the death penalty
- 2) Designate a location for letter writing before and after each service, and set up a table if there is not already one there
- 3) As soon as possible, **identify volunteers**, such as members of your church, who will staff the table before and after services; volunteers will be provided with tabling kits, including all the necessary supplies. Please have volunteers contact Kristin Bollig immediately (information below)
- 4) Publicize your Abolition Sundays with announcements, flyers, and a write-up in your weekly bulletin. CNADP is happy to provide samples for all announcements and publications.
